St Cuthbert's Church has stood at the heart of Halsall for hundreds of years as a sign of our thankfulness to God. Hello fellow residents

Many of you I'm sure will be aware, Thursday June 6th 2024 marks the 80th anniversary of D-Day which saw the largest naval, air and land operation in history.

As part of a wider tribute being held across Lancashire, the UK and Allied countries throughout the world, Shirdley Hill will also be taking the opportunity to remember the 209,000 plus Allied casualties of Operation Overlord. This includes nearly 37,000 ground forces and 16,714 air forces killed in the invasion of Normandy's Utah, Omaha, Gold, Juno and Sword beaches, and the long and bloody campaign that followed.

The bravery and sacrifice of those people in securing the peace and freedom we enjoy today will be observed by the lighting at 9:15 pm of beacons around the United Kingdom, Channel Islands, Isle of Man and UK Overseas Territories.

As such, I would like to invite you all to come together as a community to pay our own tribute to those who paid the ultimate sacrifice by lighting a beacon on Shirdley Hill green in celebration of the 'light of peace' that emerged out of the darkness of war.

Rod Birchall has very kindly manufactured and donated a magnificent reusable beacon for the occasion, with all residents attending having the opportunity to win the chance to light it.

In the finest traditions of Shirdley Hill, we will look to make this event one to remember. The village green and immediate area will be decked out with bunting, street poppies and D-Day 80 memorabilia. A marquee and tables will also be available for refreshments. (Residents are asked to bring their own refreshments and chairs as per previous similar events).

To help capture the mood, everyone is invited/encouraged to dress in 40's period clothing where possible and this theme will be reinforced with background music from the period. From 7pm. Best wishes,



Bees and Butterflies Brigade (June 2024)

The Bees and Butterflies Brigade have enjoyed some sunny and productive planting sessions so far this year – thank you to all of you who have joined in. I'm really enjoying the happy vibe of our meetings!

We sowed our wildflower seeds in the ha-ha of St Cuthbert's churchyard on the 21st April. Two weeks later they were germinating into tiny seedlings, nurtured in their warm, sheltered spot. Now, they are growing strongly and filling us with the promise of a slice of meadow filled with colour and life.

It's an exciting time, but it's important to remember that establishing a wildflower meadow takes a long time — often as long as four years. In that time, the abundance of flowers will shift and change as they colonise their new-found habitat and find ways of existing in harmony with each other. This summer, we can expect a vibrant display of colour from fast-growing annuals such as bright red field poppy and sky-blue cornflowers. Their leaves and flowers will provide food for pollinating insects but they will also provide a protective canopy for the perennial wildflowers in the mix, sheltering the upcoming generations of plants as they establish their roots. These annual species will die back with the first frosts after a long flowering season. However, their moment in the sun will have paved the way for the fastest-growing of the perennial species (plants like oxeye daisies, with their daisy-white petals and yellow centres) to thrive the following year. Please do go and have a look at how our little slice of meadow is getting on and, if you visit the churchyard regularly, I hope its evolution brings you much pleasure.

At the end of April The Bees and Butterflies Brigade were officially accepted by The Canal and River Trust as adoption partners. This sounds very grand but really means that the Trust are going to work with us to improve planting for wildlife on some of their land. A group of us wasted no time in planting up the small raised bed on the sunny side of Bridge 25, near The Saracens Head. Here, wild geranium, foxglove, feverfew and oxeye daisy are combined with late-flowering garden plants to provide colour and nectar over a long flowering season.

Our next project will be to clear and re-plant the bank on the opposite side of the canal (same side of the bridge) with a view to installing bee-friendly planting; we'll then extend the planting into the front garden of The Saracens Head. Thank you so much to the pub's new owner for his support and encouragement – these are exciting times for The Bs!

Why not join us on one of our planting sessions to make new friends and learn about bee-friendly plants? Or just pop along to where we are working and have a chat – we'll be delighted to see you. Our next planting meeting will be on Sunday 30th June from 2pm, when we'll be at The Saracens Head, doing our bit to help nature.
