

PLANNING

2019/0221/FUL - Memorial Playing Field, Halsall Road Proposal: Proposed new external wooden store

2019/0130/FUL - 42 Gregory Lane – Single storey rear extension 2019/0168/FUL - 91 Segars Lane - Two storey extension to side of dwelling

PARKING ALONG SUMMERWOOD LANE

Cars parking either side of Summerwood Lane at school times and when funerals and weddings are taking place at St Cuthbert's are causing an obstruction and prevent large vehicles, including the emergency services from passing through.

Please use the Memorial Hall car park whenever possible.

PARKING ON NEW STREET NEAR TO THE JUNCTION WITH CARR MOSS LANE

This is creating a dangerous situation for cars trying to turn out of Carr Moss Lane because their line of sight is obstructed and we would ask that people refrain from parking so close to the junction before a serious accident occurs.

PARKING ON CARR MOSS LANE NEAR TO THE JUNCTION WITH LINEKAR DRIVE

Once again the Parish Council would ask people to use some common sense when parking their cars and not to park so close to the junction as to restrict residents of Linekar Drive from being able to see oncoming cars approaching from both directions when exiting the drive.

PARKING ALONG SEGARS LANE

Cars double parking and parking on pavements are causing problems along Segars Lane. Can residents please park in their driveways if possible and leave enough room when parking on pavements to allow prams and wheelchairs to get through.

USE IT OR LOSE IT

West Lancashire Footpath Group is a registered charity (No. 511764) whose aims are to organise rambles in West Lancashire and surrounding districts, and to monitor rights of way and to report on problems of access across the borough. We are a designated group for consultation with Lancashire County Council about building developments affecting rights of way.

The group organises rambles across West Lancashire and adjacent areas, and tries to cover all the parishes in a rolling programme. Walks in Halsall often start at Halsall Church or the Saracen's Head.. Further details of walks can be found on our website (westlancsfootpathgroup.org.uk).

We have recently drawn attention to problems with Halsall 8-9-FP12 which runs from The Runnel in Halsall to Green Kettle Farm. There is a broken sign near the beginning and two deteriorating bridges over the ditches which will eventually become unusable if not repaired. We have drawn this to the attention of Lancashire CC. If you are concerned about preserving the footpath network, please report such problems by email to Lancashire County Council.

The Diocese in Europe

I must admit that I had never heard of the Diocese in Europe until 2014. When my wife and I moved our main home to France that year it became apparent that it would be a bit too far to travel to St. Cuthbert's, Halsall, each Sunday. It was Church House in Liverpool which made me aware of this Anglican diocese which covers more than 40 countries.

Within this diocese, France is an archdeaconry (population approximately 66 million people). In essence, this diocese serves the needs of Christians from an Anglican tradition who are English speaking. When in France I attend the Christ Church in the Manche. In this context, 'the Manche' refers to the local government area (or département) of 'La Manche' which borders the English Channel (or La Manche as it is known in France). Our worship actually takes place at two Roman Catholic churches each Sunday, which our fellow Christians are happy to let us use.

Morning services are held at 11h00 in the church at Gratot-Hommëel, and at 17h00 at Virey. Whilst British expats constitute the majority of the congregations, there are also some Americans who are resident locally and who take advantage of the opportunity to attend worship in English. The fact that we are allowed to use Roman Catholic church buildings indicates that ecumenical relationships locally are very good. Overall, the position of Christianity, and indeed religion as a whole, in French society is very different to that in the UK. When in France, I remember the worship of our united benefice in my prayers, and when in the UK I do the same with regard to the worship at Christ Church in the Manche. If ever you feel like joining me in forming a bridge of prayer between our congregations, please feel free to do so.

Lancashire Best Kept Village Competition 2019



The entry form has been sent in and we expect judges to visit us four times between 8th June and 21st July. Please do your bit by checking that the front of your property, including the roadside, is in good order. Thank you!

The judges look at every part of the village in detail including private housing, business premises, community buildings, play areas, waterways and notice boards. These are all awarded marks which are added up to give us our position for the overall award of Lancashire Best Kept Village.

This year we have also entered some areas for special attention, and hopefully, some special awards!! They are the school, the Church, the Saracens Head, the Cricket Grounds and the Village Bakehouse. On the other hand we are allowed to highlight some areas which can be ignored by the judges because they are in poor condition, but they can only be exempt for one year, and we have to give a good reason for them to be discounted in the overall marks.

Our "exclusion zones" this year are :-

1 The housing development in progress near the top of Carr Moss Lane

2 The redundant brick building being renovated on New Street (next to what was Blundell & Rimmers)

3 The disused haulage yard by the canal bridge in Summerwood Lane (formerly Gaskells)


4 The canal bridge railings in Summerwood Lane

Gardener`s Corner

May at-a-glance

May is, for me, one of the most exciting & loveliest months of the year in the garden, because you can see new flowers opening every time you step outdoors & the best of the year is still to come. Longer evenings and warmer weather brings out the gardener in all of us. Happy gardening.

General garden Tasks

Prepare the soil for bedding plants.

Keep on top of weeding & hoeing -its endless I know!

Watch out for and deal with pests using biological controls & organic remedies. Feed established lawns if not done in April.

Pinch out any green shoots appearing on variegated trees & shrubs.

Tie in new growth of climbers & wall shrubs.

Clip beech, hornbeam, box & Leyland cypress late this month or early next. Cut privet.

Support perennials.

Divide clumps of primroses & polyanthus after flowering.

Continue deadheading & feeding spring-flowering bulbs.

Plant & train sweet peas. Plant tubs, troughs, window boxes & hanging baskets in the middle of this month at the earliest.

Sow swede, beetroot, maincrop carrots, peas, raddish & spring onion.

Direct-sow frost-tender vegetables, e.g. French & runner beans, sweetcorn & courgettes.

Plant out leeks.

Harvest overwintered onions.

Water soft fruit bushes with swelling fruit & newly planted fruit trees.

Protect strawberries from birds.

Continue to prick out seedlings, young plants & cuttings.

Continue hardening off bedding plants ready for end of month outdoor planting. Plant tomatoes in early may & sweet peppers, chillies, melons & cucumbers late May.

Harvest baby potatoes.

Divide overgrown waterlilies in the pond.

Introduce new fish to the water garden now the weather is warmer.

Watch out for

Late frosts – protect with fleece. Pests in the greenhouse & containers.

Plants in their Prime

Rhododendrons. Clematis `Nelly Moser`. Clematis Montana. Viburnum. Dianthus. Wisteria. Euphorbia. Geum. Lonicera. Corydalis. Rosa `Lutea`. Tree peonies. Chaenomeles. Cotoneaster. Kerria japonica. Potentilla. Sambuscus Nigra. Spiraea. Caellia.


